We celebrated two exciting milestones: the 30th anniversary of our first conservation easement and reaching our long-held goal of surpassing 3,000 acres conserved. After completing four easements totaling 352 acres in 2019, Scenic Rivers now holds conservation easements on 3,124 acres of natural and scenic land in Anne Arundel County.

Many of you joined us in October 2019 to celebrate these achievements at our first-ever *Conservation Celebration*. Reflecting on that evening now, we are humbled by what a gift it was to gather together in person to honor and connect with the partners, friends, and supporters who have helped us succeed.

The pages of this annual report reflect on last year's high points and preview some of what we hope to do this year. We hope you'll join us in looking back on 2019 with pride. **We did all of this because of your support.**

Financial Overview



FISCAL YEAR 2019 FINANCES

We are pleased to report that Scenic Rivers concluded 2019 with a healthy operating surplus. The majority of the surplus is tied to restricted grant funds carrying over into the new year with the remainder being surplus operating funds. This surplus has been a small source of comfort as we navigate the complexities that have arisen in the first half of 2020. The "Specific Conservation Project Grants" cited below reflect several significant grants from the Anne Arundel County Forestry and Forested Land Protection Grant Program, which funded three of the four properties conserved in 2019.
