

I'm thrilled to introduce myself as the new executive director of Scenic Rivers Land Trust. Stepping into this role, I'm both honored and energized by the incredible legacy of conservation Scenic Rivers has built—and even more excited about what lies ahead.

2024 was a year of momentum and meaningful milestones. We renewed our national accreditation from the Land Trust Accreditation Commission, reaffirming our commitment to the highest standards in conservation. We welcomed our first Chesapeake Conservation and Climate Corps member, Luke Lanham, whose energy and drive are already expanding our



impact. We also added a key member to our team—Erin Kilbane, who brings deep experience and passion to our conservation and stewardship work. Most importantly, we added 84 acres of protected land to our community's green network—conserving forests and wetlands in Pasadena and a beloved family forest in Crownsville.

We've also set a bold course for the future with our new Strategic Plan, grounded in updated Mission, Vision, and Values. It charts a path toward ambitious conservation goals, deeper community engagement, and long-term sustainability.

A core part of our vision is connecting more people to the lands we protect. I believe that increasing our community outreach, improving access, and strengthening partnerships are essential to our success. When people experience the beauty and importance of conserved land firsthand, they are more likely to become advocates, stewards, and champions of this work. That connection is how we build lasting support and ensure these places remain protected for generations to come.

CELEBRATING 35 YEARS OF CONSERVATION

1988 - FOUNDED AS THE SEVERN RIVER LAND TRUST

First voluntary conservation easement secured on a property along the Severn River.

NEWS & NOTES



BODKIN CREEK EASEMENT

In summer 2024, Scenic Rivers permanently protected 47 acres of forested land in the Bodkin Creek watershed in Pasadena—our 80th conservation easement!

Once slated for luxury development, this ecologically important land is now protected forever thanks to an easement granted by Belle Grove Corporation and the persistence of a local couple who championed the project and purchased the property to steward it.

Identified on our "Top 100 Properties to Conserve" list, the forest is a local gem—home to diverse native species, over 800 feet of streams, three acres of wetlands, and even a Champion Tree pignut hickory. The property lies within the County's Green Infrastructure Network and the Chesapeake Bay Critical Area and is recognized by Maryland DNR as "Significant for Biodiversity Conservation."

Funding provided by the Anne Arundel County Forestry and Forested Land Protection Grant Program will also fund removing invasive plants and restoring over 3.5 acres with native trees and shrubs through our Healthy Forests program.

SCENIC RIVERS RECEIVES NATIONAL ACCREDITATION RENEWAL

Scenic Rivers once again earned national accreditation from the Land Trust Accreditation Commission, confirming that our work meets the highest standards for conservation, governance, and lasting stewardship.

This rigorous renewal process involved a comprehensive third-party review of our policies, finances, and practices—reaffirming that the lands we protect, like the forests of Bacon Ridge and the wetlands of Swan Creek, will remain conserved forever.



Accreditation is more than a seal of approval—it's a promise to our community that we are a respected land trust, committed to protecting Anne Arundel County's most special places for generations to come.

2024 FINANCIAL OVERVIEW


STABLE, STRATEGIC, AND GROWING



CONSERVATION EASEMENT TOUR: GARMAN SAWMILL AND FARM

Conservation Champions Circle members joined us for a guided tour of the Garman Conservation Easement in Crownsville. Landowners Gary and Janet Garman warmly welcomed the group to explore their family's five-acre homestead farm, the Garman Brothers sawmill, and a portion of the conserved forest. The property—130 acres in total, including the sawmill, farmland, and 120 acres of forest—was permanently protected in 2023 in partnership with the Maryland Department of Natural Resources.
